As part of the Youth Development Programme implemented since 2013, 9 additional Adolescent and Youth-Friendly Clinics were established under provincial, soum and district health centers, and there are currently 27 such clinics operating in the country.	
	As part of its Sixth Country Programme of Support to the Government of Mongolia, UNFPA agreed to support the Ministry of Health to revise and improve the standards of sexual and reproductive health and formulate standard operating procedures (SOP) for adolescent and youth-friendly health services.

Other relevant information or special conditions, if any:	Given growth of young population in recent years, Mongolia is facing challenges in terms of safeguarding health for youth, in particular sexual and reproductive health. These include an increase in STI incidence rates amongst youth, adolescent birth rate, and abortion rate, compounded with the early start of sexual intercourse.
	Adolescent and youth friendly clinics have been established jointly with MoH, under the provincial and district health centers as part of the project to reach out to youth in each locality, with more focus on those who are out-of-school, unemployed, with disabilities, and otherwise marginalized.
