## TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANT (NATIONAL)

Hiring Office:	United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) Country Office, Mongolia.
Purpose of the consultancy	The overall objective of the consultancy is to conduct a thorough assessment of the current School Health Services in Mongolia, with the aim of enhancing the delivery of health services in general education schools.
Scope of work:  (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	The UNFPA Mongolia Country Office (CO) is seeking a National Consultant to assess the state of School Health Services in Mongolia. This analysis is a key component of the "Fostering Adolescent Well-being through Integrated Health and Development Initiatives" project. The initiative aims to integrate health and educational strategies to enhance adolescents' well-being, reflecting UNICEF and UNFPA's shared commitment to meeting Mongolia's youth health needs.
	Although there have been significant improvements in healthcare and education in Mongolia, a unified and detailed school health policy has yet to be established. Recent changes in legislation particularly a crucial clause 28.10 added to the education law, which was approved in June 2023 mark a step towards a stronger school-based health monitoring surveillance system. Additionally there is an ongoing initiative to ensure that all general education schools have medical doctors. So far, their role has mainly been limited to looking after oral health and individual hygiene of school-children.  Overall Objective: The overall objective of the assessment is to explore areas for strengthening the School Health Program in Mongolia  Specific Objectives:  Specific Objective 1: To review the school health concept in the context of laws, policies, strategies, and programs of the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education.  Specific Objective 2: To seek the opinion of policymakers, school managers, and school health doctors on the current health service delivery mechanism through schools, the strengths, gaps, and recommendations for improvement.  Specific Objective 3: To assess the actual health care service delivery in selected schools, including the infrastructure, services provided, surveillance and monitoring, referrals, and recording and reporting mechanism,  Specific Objective 4: To explore the opinion of students and parents on the school health program and their priorities to be included.
	The insights from the assessment will inform the development of a school health services plan that aligns with the Mongolian Government's strategic goals. This plan will propose interventions to enhance existing services and chart a path forward that is consistent with government strategies and WHO-UNESCO international standards. The objective is to address service gaps and elevate the standard of student care.  Furthermore, this consultancy will play a pivotal role in supporting the government's goal to implement a school-based health monitoring system in collaboration with the Ministry of Health (MoH) and the Ministry of Education and Science (MoES).

Monitoring and progress control, including reporting requirements, periodicity format and deadline:	Under the direct supervision of the UNFPA Programme Analyst for Adolescents and Youth, the consultant will closely collaborate with the UNICEF Programme team. Reporting requirements, formats, and deadlines will be finalized during the initial briefing session.  The reporting process will include bi-weekly updates provided by the consultant via email, highlighting progress made in delivering the agreed-upon outcomes, as per the jointly approved template at the commencement of the consultancy.  Subsequently, the draft report will undergo a comprehensive review conducted by a committee composed of representatives from UNFPA, UNICEF, MoH, MoES, and other pertinent stakeholders. Feedback received during the review process will be incorporated, leading to the finalization and approval of the report.

It is anticipated that the consultancy will be governed by an individual consultancy contract under standard UNFPA terms and conditions. UNFPA will pay a consultancy fee according to the current UNFPA-approved schedule of rates at a level to be negotiated.
