Purpose and background of consultancy:	UNFPA Mongolia is hiring an Individual Consultant to do the script proofreading, content revision, and editing of the selected AMAZE videos and train teachers and parents on the usage of videos.	
	United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) Mongolia has been working to ensure that young people in Mongolia have continued access to vital sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights (SRHRR) information, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic. With face-to-face education became impossible, it has been essential to develop and utilize educational resources that can be used in distance learning to reach out to young people and ensure that the most vulnerable are not left behind.	
	In 2020, the Country Office (CO) established a partnership with UNESCO and "Advocates for Youth" NGO, an organization specializing in SRHRR videos, to adapt AMAZE videos for young Mongolians. AMAZE is a video-based sexual health education resource for youth ages 10-14 designed to provide an honest, accurate, and age-appropriate information. Through short, professionally created animated videos, AMAZE seeks to empower young people to attain the information that is often overly censored in their schools. AMAZE pioneered a strategy to educate young people and it uses research to conceptualize, deliver, message and frame sexual health education.	
	As a result of the partnership with UNESCO, 28 factual and age-appropriate videos for children up to 14 years of age have been translated and adapted into the Mongolian language. Moreover, jointly with the Advocates for Youth NGO, UNFPA adapted the other 22 videos in 2021. A total of 50 videos are accessible at: https://medle.mn - an online resource for the e-learning platform run by the Ministry of Education and Science (MoES), which the CO has established as part of the UN Multi-Partner Trust Fund Programme (MPTF).	
	These educational videos serve as a teaching tool for school teachers who are responsible for provision of sexuality education classes to schoolchildren.	
	The UNFPA desires to adapt more videos for a Mongolian audience to extend its reach to young people. Thus, an individual consultant will provide technical support for the proofreading and editing the contents of selected 20 videos.	
Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	Therefore, UNFPA Mongolia CO is looking for a national consultant who will work closely with UNFPA and comprehensive sexuality education (CSE) experts for a period of one month.
